SUMMARY:

On July 5, 2016 at approximately 11:56 PM:

A verbal disturbance and subsequent physical fight started between two neighbors in the 200 block of Carol Ave. after a "road-rage" incident. Family members from a nearby residence went to the aid of their mother who was struck during a physical confrontation with the other driver. At this point the incident started to escalate.

Upon hearing the disturbance, a third party neighbor called the police. Loud yelling and threats were overheard by the third party. After calling the police the third party ran out of the house and yelled at the people involved in the fight that police were called and told them all to leave. The group that was in the street, still arguing with the original party, then walked across the street and started threatening the 30-year old female that had called the police. One of the people in the group, a 16-year old female juvenile, then physically attacked the 30 year old woman.

Upon completing another 911 call the 30 year old woman's husband looked out a window and saw his wife being quickly surrounded by the angry group of people. The 31-year old man armed himself with handgun before exiting the house to help his wife. The man kept his firearm concealed as he broke up the physical fight between his wife and the 16-year old suspect. As the man and his wife started to retreat back to their house, two men and the 16-year old suspect continued to threaten them. When the juvenile produced a 6" steak knife and threatened the man, he produced his firearm and warned them all to stay back. When the juvenile came at the man, still armed with the knife, the homeowner shot her. Two of the three rounds struck the juvenile and she went down.

Red Bluff Police arrived at that time and detained the parties involved. Dallas Goodman, 22-years old from Red Bluff, was providing first-aid to the juvenile. Goodman became uncooperative with officers and was arrested for delaying their investigation. Goodman resisted arrest and was also armed with a concealed knife. He was subsequently booked into jail for interfering in a criminal investigation, violently resisting arrest and possession of dirk or dagger.

The juvenile was transported to St. Elizabeth Hospital where she underwent surgery for her life-threatening wounds. She is currently in serious but stable condition.

The man who shot the juvenile was detained by police and interviewed. His statement, along with corroborating statements and physical evidence indicate he fired his weapon in self defense. He was subsequently released from custody.

This case is still under investigation and will be submitted to the Tehama County District Attorney for review. Additional charges will likely be requested against the parties who initiated this incident. It appears that alcohol was also a likely factor in the actions of the aggressors.
