SUMMARY:

On March 27, 2019 at about 8:00 A.M.,

Information was obtained during a threats investigation that juveniles were possibly in possession of firearms and narcotics at a residence on Little Avenue. A search warrant was completed and served at the location. Narcotics, replica firearms, and drug paraphernalia were located and easily accessible by juveniles living in the residence. Due to the living conditions at the residence, and the easy accessibility to narcotics by juveniles, several arrests were made. The following subjects were arrested and booked either at the Tehama County Jail, Tehama County Juvenile Justice Facility, or released on scene:

- 1) 17-year-old juvenile was arrested and booked for 273.5(a) P.C., Domestic Violence, and 11377(a) H&S, Possession of Methamphetamine.
- 2) 39-year-old Red Bluff resident, Salvador Rabago, was arrested and booked for an outstanding arrest warrant.
- 3) 34-year-old Red Bluff resident, Savanna Rabago, was arrested and booked for 273a(a) P.C., Child Endangerment.
- 4) 59-year-old Red Bluff resident, Rosa Rabago, was arrested and booked for 273a(a) P.C., Child Endangerment.
- 5) 33-year-old Red Bluff Resident, Kary Stowe, was arrested and released by citation for 11350(a) H&S, Possession of Heroin, and an outstanding arrest warrant.

Five juveniles ranging in age of 12, 12, 8, 6, and 3 years old, were taken into protective custody and released to Tehama County Child Protective Services at the scene.

This investigation was a collaborative effort between the Red Bluff Police Department, Tehama County Probation Department, Tehama County Social Services, and the Tehama Interagency Drug Enforcement task force.

Additional charges stemming from the search will be filed with the Tehama County D.A.'s Office.
